





English Education in the Fourth Industrial Revolution Era

The Fourth Industrial Revolution is underway and it can have a substantial effect on English education in general and writing instruction in particular. New technologies and approaches such as automated writing evaluation (AWE) programs have been employed in writing classes. The main use of AWE was initially the grading of standardized tests like the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT), replacing one of the two original human raters; however, AWE has recently been used as a classroom instructional tool as well. The various AWE programs available include Criterion from ETS, My Access from Vantage Learning, Summary Street from Pearson Knowledge Analysis Technologies, and Writing Roadmap from McGraw-Hill. Among these, Criterion is the most frequently used program in ESL (English as a Second Language) classes and has two complementary applications called e-rater and critique. E-rater is a scoring application that assigns holistic scores on a six-point scale. Critique is an application that analyzes errors in five categories: grammar, organization & development, usage, mechanics, and style. Criterion provides two types of feedback to students: a holistic score and trait feedback.

AWE feedback led to sentence-level revisions such as those to grammar and mechanics rather than paragraph-level revisions such as those to content and organization. The fact that AWE feedback is effective for revising sentence-level errors can be a great advantage to EFL (English as a Foreign Language) students, because many Korean students tend to directly translate from their native language into English, which inevitably induces sentence-level errors. This writing habit can lead to poor word choice, as well as awkward phrase and sentence construction. Thus, EFL students generally benefit more from feedback on grammar, usage, and mechanics than on organization and the development of ideas.

Considering that there are not many native speakers of English instructors present in the Korean university context to help with editing, and non-native speakers of English instructors are often overburdened with a heavy workload, AWE offers a practical solution to the problem of providing students with such feedback. The use of AWE in the classroom can be very useful if grammar is the focus of the lesson or class curriculum. AWE contributes to student writing performance in terms of linguistic accuracy, by means of immediate error feedback. The AWE system, with automatic detection and correction tools, can help Korean students with appropriate word usage, which will, in turn, contribute to the development of their writing skills. Although some criticize the use of AWE as an instructional tool and argue that it is best suited for test-taking strategies rather than the development of writing, acquiring test-taking strategies and getting high scores on large-scale writing assessments is still important for Korean students.

AWE program possesses great potential as an instructional tool for Korean writing classes in the Fourth Industrial Revolution era, due to the ways it supplements the revision process. However, although the AWE program may act like a private tutor in the Korean context, it cannot replace. instructors. Writing instructors in the Korean context can use AWE to overcome students' reluctance to write and to help with local errors.

X-Corps Competition

On November 17, 2020, the X-Corps competition concluded. The X-Corps competition will be unfamiliar and mysterious to most students of the English Department, so I would like to tell you what the competition is and what I felt while preparing for the competition. The competition began in March of this year. At that time, I was very skeptical about my major and social life radius. Of course, English is useful in various situations, but I wanted to have some more professional skills. I also wanted to solve social problems and round out my self-introduction letter by winning various competitions. At that time, the X-Corps competition hosted by the school was perfect for me.

X-Corps is a competition in which companies, professors, graduate students, and undergraduate students from various majors team up and develop products to solve social problems. With the help of my close brother I teamed up with the Department of Urban Engineering. It was not easy from the start. In the first step of preparing for the competition we were thinking about what social problems to solve. We wanted to help society, but the end products that we would have had to make did not match our planning and were beyond our abilities. We needed to adjust our ideas. Finally, we

decided to create an artificial intelligence camera to crack down on vehicles that over-emit fine dust. Most of the fine dust generated in Korea comes from vehicles. The government imposes sanctions on vehicles that are too old and tries to get rid of the generated fine dust, but there is no device to crack down on newer vehicles that emit too much fine dust. We decided to make a device similar to a speed camera, that would measure fine dust and crack down on the vehicles in question.







We divided the roles according to our respective abilities. I could not do anything about the machine, so another team member was in charge. I was instead in charge of computer coding and video editing for product promotion, as well as development direction and product design. I did not actually know how to do any of those things, but that did not mean that I could not do them. I studied these subjects whenhever I had time. Of course it was not easy, but it was so much fun to learn new things and explore new fields on my own. Our team had a lot of conversations and worries while developing the product. We spent a lot of time together, and we came to trust each other. I learned a lot from each team member's abilities and actions, especially how much the Urban Engineering Department learns and endeavors for the future. What I learned from my team members' appearances seemed much more valuable than professional skills. We successfully completed the product and showed it to many judges on the day of the competition. As a result, we won both the Grand Prize and the Silver Prize!

This competition may not help me with my major and future. However, as I prepared for this competition I found out that I was a frog in a well, and felt that I should strive harder for my future. Regardless of what I learned, I realized how valuable it was to learn something on my own, and to cooperate with people and achieve results. The English Language and Literature Department students who read this may think there is no connection, but I strongly recommend they attend the X-Corps competition. At the least, I recommend they step into a new field and learn something new. I am sure they will learn a lot and gain a new perspective. The X-Corps competition is supported by the government and various universities. They offer more than five million won in support fees, and invite professional instructors to provide quality lectures. Whether your challenge succeeds or fails, I support your life.


